#### **Dear Friends of Denise Louie Education Center,**

This year, perhaps more than ever, we appreciate the power of people reconnecting to each other, and the priorities, we have for growth and expansion. We have a great deal to celebrate: the 100+ guests who attended our in-person auction; the Kraken partnership where families experienced the joy of skating and the tremendous pride that staff had when the math scores of 97% of our preschool children exceeded expectations for children of their age after we implemented our new math curriculum. We continue to expand our reach, and with the \$7.4 capital campaign wrapped up and construction underway, soon 97 more children will be served at the Denise Louie Education Center at Yesler. To accommodate the increase in community demand for our services, we stand ready to generate the resources necessary to invest in, grow, and sustain a high-quality early learning workforce. We know this is no easy feat in a city like Seattle, where the cost of living is so high, but are confident we will meet this challenge, and our ongoing aims to provide exceptional services, with you at our side.

### **Our Children**

#### **Ensuring a Successful Start**

Early Head Start (EHS) provides low-income families and women with children ages birth to three or who are pregnant with services to prepare their child for success. These services include weekly 90-minute home visits to provide caregivers with early learning activities, parent support, and health services in their home languages; bi-monthly socialization events to bring together caregivers to learn about topics they choose, from financial planning to health education; and early intervention through regular assessments of children's developmental milestones to identify special needs and provide resources as early as possible.

- 52 infants, 85 toddlers, 7 pregnant mothers
- 63% of EHS children improved or maintained 5 out of 6 developmental domains that indicate school readiness



### **Preparing Kids for Kindergarten**

Our preschool program serves predominantly immigrant and refugee families whose children are between ages three and five, and have an income under \$25,100 for a family of four. Priority for enrollment into the program is given to children in foster care, homeless families, and children with special needs.

- 4 preschool centers (1 more, Yesler) under construction
- 217 children served throughout the program year
- 5.5% of Head Start eligible children in Seattle were served by DLEC
- 64% received dental, hearing, vision, and/or physical exams



During the 2021-2022 program year, 73% of children enrolled in the program received medical exams and 55% of the children are up-to-date on dental exams. These numbers are significantly higher than the number of children that received medical or dental exams last program year (46% and 21% respectively).

We hope that this trend continues to grow as vaccinations for children aged 5 and under are now available and families are becoming more comfortable visiting medical and dental offices as we slowly progress out of the pandemic.


# **Efforts to Prepare Children for Kindergarten**

Denise Louie Education Center works to ensure that all children are ready for school. With this in mind, and with the help of parents and teachers, we developed school readiness goals that are tailored to each program. Each school readiness goal was created using information from parents, teachers, and data collected through assessment and observation tools.

During the program year 201-2022, our goal was that 85% of children would meet kindergarten readiness targets in 5 of the 6 domains. The data shows that we have met that goal in PY21-22 with our children meeting or exceeding the 85% goal in all domains. The latest data from the Washington Office of Superintendent of Public Instruction show that DLEC exceeded the average percent of students ready for kindergarten in Washington state by the end of the Program year 2021-2022.


The Washington Office of Superintendent of Public Instruction has not yet updated its averages for the percent of students ready for kindergarten. The averages are currently based on 2019-2020 Washington State goals. We will be sure to update this information as soon as it is available to us. Moving forward, we will use this information to consider different strategies around professional development to ensure all sites meet benchmarks in all areas and continue to monitor student outcomes.

# 2022-2023 Program Budget

The program's operating budget includes Expenses for Educational and Program Services, as well as Management and General expenses. Education and Program Expenses include line items for instruction, such as teacher salaries and benefits, classroom supplies, and other teaching-related expenses; family engagement, which includes social service staff and support for parent activities and kindergarten transition; interventions, which include health, mental health, and nutrition; staff professional development, which includes training and technical assistance for staff and supervision and support expenses.






### 2021-2022 DLEC Family Types

# **Engaging and Listening to Our Parents & Guardians**

Last program year, Denise Louie hosted monthly parent nights where families help choose topics and speakers to identify and support their most immediate needs, with topics ranging from financial literacy, nutrition, and special needs. Our preschool classrooms also have parent-teacher conferences and home visits throughout the year to facilitate more intimate dialogues on children's educational progress. We encourage families to help children with their homework, as well as to provide us with ongoing feedback, and we welcome families to volunteer in classrooms. When March 2020 came around. all of our meetings and trainings became virtual.

Our Policy Council is integral to our programs' success and represents the families we serve. Every year, parent representatives are elected from both HS and EHS programs. Our parentled Policy Council functions in partnership with our Board of Directors to approve policies, budgets and hiring decisions, as well as provide program feedback.


Our family support and home visiting teams connect and educate parents on available resources from housing and nutrition to immigrant rights.

# **Play and Learn Successes!**

### A gentle transition back into the world.

Play & Learn is a program for parents and caregivers of young children to learn and explore together. This facilitated program is designed to support the development of children's school readiness skills and to provide education and support for parents and caregivers.

Originally provided at the Lake City, Columbia, and Rainier Beach Libraries, these sessions were transitioned into a weekly virtual session, hosted by the Seattle Public Libraries and


open to the public.



While offered in the virtual space in 2020, we transitioned our group for Mercy Magnuson Place families from Zoom into the outdoors in the fall of 2021.

#### Overall, in 2021-2022:

- 257 participants joined us for Play & Learn.
  - o 141 children
  - o 105 caregivers
  - 11 guests, including authors from our newest community partner, Duck Duck Books, who began hosting a monthly multilingual storytime within our sessions for our virtual families.
- We held 101 virtual and in-person sessions through out the year.
- Our online virtual Play & Learn library that we created in 2020 continues to be accessed by families with nearly 500 new views on YouTube.

We wrapped up our \$7.4 million capital campaign for Yesler Terrace in 2021 positioning us for more early learning expansion. The Yesler Terrace Capital Project will provide combined living, early learning, and community-based retail business space to meet the needs of families with incomes from 30% - 60% of Area Median Income (AMI).


